The Gates Millennium Scholars (GMS) Program is funded by a \$1.6 billion grant from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. Established in 1999, the goal of GMS is to educate “Leaders for America’s Future”™ by providing eligible students with good-through-graduation undergraduate scholarships as well as the opportunity to continue through to a doctoral degree in seven GMS-funded fields. At this workshop, attendees will learn more about the GMS Program as well as how to make themselves competitive applicants.

Who should attend? Students in 9-12 (and their parents/guardians) who are:

- African American, American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian Pacific Islander American or Hispanic American
- 10th graders with a cumulative GPA of 2.8 or above, 11th graders with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above, 12th graders with a cumulative GPA of 3.3 or above, all on an 4.0 unweighted scale, and GED recipients (9th graders and GED recipients have no GPA requirement to attend.)
